

## Judges Resident outside the UK

It would not be reasonable to ask CC awarding non-resident UK judges to join the KC Academy; however they may do so if they wish.

Several different types of scenario have been identified below.

	<b>Judging Privileges</b> Level 1 criteria – must prove to show societies that the introductory judges training in their country of residence has been undertaken, by making available the pass certificate or having written confirmation from their KC, along with having a proven interest of a minimum of <b>5</b> years in one or more aspects of the breeding and exhibiting of pedigree dogs, and have 6 days stewarding experience in their own country (a) Up to 3 classes or 4 classes if one is a Puppy class (5/6 classes for Stud Book Band E breeds) of any breed at any show. Level 2 criteria can be achieved – Have attended a UK breed seminar & passed the multiple choice exam plus above requirements. (b) Above plus unlimited number of classes in that breed at an Open/Limited show and at a Championship Show without CCs. Judge will be featured on Find a Judge	Yes (JCF L2)	It is the show society’s responsibility to ensure that the judge meets the required criteria. No CPD required. 5.	<b>Overseas Judges who are now resident in the UK and were CC judges in home country</b>		
	<p>KC will accept previous UK KC approvals prior to moving to the UK to award CC, Group and Best in Show with relevant judging privileges. For all subsequent appointments to judge in the UK will be following the Judges Competency Framework.</p> <p><b>Judging privileges will relate to the relevant level achieved.</b></p>	Yes	<p><b>NEW PROPOSAL</b></p> <p>FROM  'Persons who move to the UK are considered for the purposes of Open Show judging as resident in the UK after 3 years. For the purposes of approval to award CCs and the completion of questionnaires, they should be treated as resident in the UK after 3 years but overseas judges for the first 3 years of residence. <b>7.</b>	<b>Judges resident in Northern Ireland (awarding CCs)</b>		
	<p>Non CC judges resident in Northern Ireland can follow the JCF (Levels 1 &amp; 2) until such time as they wish to be approved to award CCs at which point they need to decide KC or IKC jurisdiction.  KC jurisdiction following JCF  IKC treated as a paragraph 2 or 3 above.</p>	<p>Non CC appointments – Yes   CC appointment – discretionary</p>	<p>These judges are not covered by the FCI agreement.
