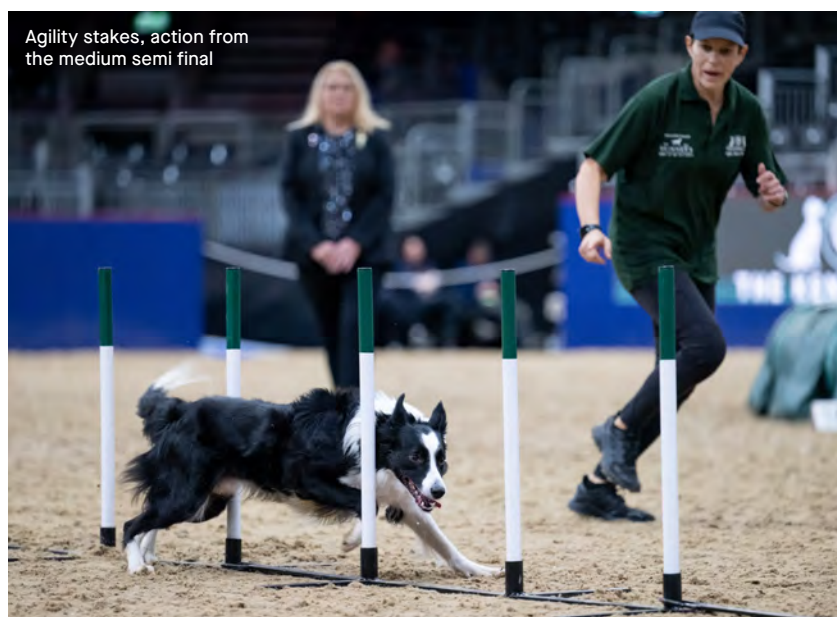

Fantastic performances from agility stars at London International Horse Show

At the 2023 event, The Kennel Club hosted more agility competitions than ever before at The London International Horse Show, which took place at London ExCeL, from 14-18 December.

The Kennel Club Agility Stakes finals, held in association with Skinner's, are one of the most prestigious agility competitions in the world. The five finals saw stars of agility who had earned qualification in competitions throughout the year compete across small, medium, large, intermediate and large ABC (Anything But Collie) categories.

The winners of The Kennel Club Agility Stakes, held in the International Arena, were:

- **Large ABC** - Megan Meade with her German Shorthaired Pointer, Rekkitt Robyn, from Newton Aycliffe, County Durham.
- **Small** - Martin Reid with his Shetland Sheepdog, Get It With Eager To Work, from Leamington Spa, Warwickshire.
- **Intermediate** - Mark Den Dunnen with his Border Collie, Devongem Be A Bright Star, from the Forest of Dean.
- **Large** - Dalton Meredith with his Border Collie, Ag Ch Fandabidozi Eclipse Of Dust, from Bristol.
- **Medium** - Toni Dawkins with her Miniature American Shepherd, Ag Ch Bachero Cross My Heart, from Chapel Hill, Lincolnshire.

New competitions for 2023, sponsored by Agria and held in the New Horizons Plastics London Arena at the ExCeL, included three Crufts Semi-Finals, which saw dogs putting their best paw forward to gain a spot in the final, held at Crufts, in March 2024.

The winners of the Crufts Semi-Finals were:

- **Medium ABC** - Stephanie Best with her Shetland Sheepdog, Z-Atomic Spice Koryfej, from Ringwood, Hampshire.

- **Large Novice ABC** - Emma Wallis with her Australian Shepherd, Stockyard Ruffstock Rodeo, from Castleford, Leeds.
- **Intermediate Novice ABC** - Pam Mayhew with her Stabyhoun, Staby What from Norwich, Norfolk.

The New Horizons Plastics London Arena also hosted finals of the Discover Dogs Small/Mixi Pairs Challenge and The Kennel Club Starters Cup.

The winners of The Kennel Club Starters Cup Final were:

- **Small** - Ian Law with his Cocker Spaniel, Kellandbrook Mojito Of Wyanfaest, from Bristol.

A number of fascinating art exhibitions planned in 2024

The Kennel Club Art Gallery is a world class collection of art and artefacts about dogs. This year, we have a number of fascinating exhibitions planned including a capsule exhibition dedicated to Valerie Foss and a gallery display involving dogs in advertising.

DOGS IN ADVERTISING

The 2024 exhibition programme begins with Dogs in Advertising. It will be a broad historical survey of how dogs and their associated qualities such as trust, loyalty and protection have been used to advertise products as varied as banking, paint products, clothing and toys. The exhibits correspond with the growth of interest in the Dog Fancy across the 19th Century and extend up to the 1980's and will include many original vintage advertisements and artefacts from well-known brands that visitors will fondly recognise. Humble promotional products such as badges, water bowls, postcards and toys will be on display alongside original artworks and glorious trophies such as the Jeyes Gold Cup which was first offered by Messers. Jeyes' Sanitary Compounds Co. Ltd for Best Cocker at Crufts in 1927.



DRAWINGS OF DOGS

Opening in September and extending into 2025 there will be an exhibition that concentrates on the many beautiful drawings of dogs held in the Art Collection. Since the early 2000's the perception of drawing as a medium has moved away from being seen as a preparatory tool and it is now understood as a stand-alone medium in its own right. In tandem with this recent cultural development the Gallery has been developing its collection of drawings and this exhibition will include works by artists such as Marjorie Cox, Barbara Robinson Tester, Julie Brenan and Gifford Ambler, many of which are being exhibited for the first time. Expect delicate pencil, exuberant pastel, elegant lines and, of course, many champion dogs.



DEIRDRE ASHDOWN CAPSULE EXHIBITION

The Kennel Club has been steadily accruing a strong collection of original works and prints by the contemporary artist Deirdre Ashdown who is well-known for her wonderful pen and ink drawings of dogs. A huge variety of breeds of dog will be featured in the exhibition which spans her artistic career and will also include her commemorative works for the UK Toy Dog Society.



VALERIE FOSS CAPSULE EXHIBITION

The Library and Collections team are planning a capsule exhibition in the Gallery Foyer celebrating the lifelong commitment to The Kennel Club and dogs of former Honorary Life Member, Valerie Foss, who passed away in 2023. The Exhibition will showcase Valerie's many generous donations to The Kennel Club's collections and photographs documenting her career and life in dogs as well as her contribution to the Library and Gallery Panel and the formation of the Gallery in 2003.

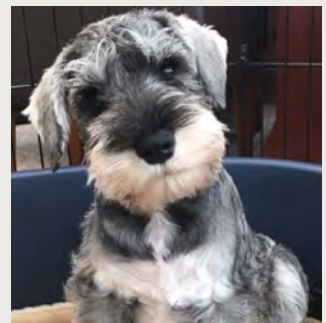

AMENDMENTS TO BREED STANDARD

At its recent meeting the Board approved the following amendments:

PORTUGUESE WATER DOG

General Appearance Robust, well balanced, of almost square shape, very strongly muscled on shoulders. Hard, penetrating and attentive expression.

Body Length from point of shoulder to point of buttock approximately equal to height at withers. Withers are wide and not prominent. Chest wide and deep, reaching to elbow. Ribs well sprung and carried well back. Short, strong loin. Moderate tuck-up. Croup only slightly inclined.

Tail The tail is a distinct feature of the breed and should be medium set, thick at base and tapering, not reaching below the hock. When attentive, carried in a ring not reaching beyond the middle of the loin.

KENNEL CLUB RULE A11

The Committee having carefully considered the evidence, find that the complaint brought under Kennel Club Rule A11 a (1) (b) against Mr Adam Davidson namely that he behaved discredibly or prejudicially to the interests of the canine world in posting denigrating and undermining remarks on social media including extremely offensive comments directed at individual breed show judges and dogs which have won awards, is upheld.

The Committee impose the following penalties:

1. To warn him as to his future conduct [A11 j (1)]
2. To censure him [A11 j (2)]
3. To disqualify him from exhibiting at, taking part in, attending and/or having any connection with any event licensed by the Club. If any person disqualified under this sub-paragraph shall attend any canine event whilst disqualified the Board shall have the power to increase the period of disqualification [A11 j (4)]
5. To disqualify him from being or becoming a member of any canine club or society registered with or affiliated to the Kennel Club [A11 j (5)]
6. To disqualify him from acting as an Officer or serving on the Committee of any canine society [A11 j (6)]
7. To disqualify him from taking part in the management of any event licensed by the Club [A11 j (7)]
8. To disqualify him from judging at any event licensed by the Club [A11 j (8)]

The disqualifications are to be for a period of Five (5) years from 30 November 2023.

The Committee, following the impositions of these penalties, would draw the attention of the Respondent to the effect of Rule A11 sub-section n.

The postings from Mr Davidson, show an utter disregard for breed showing.

The language used was extreme and appalling and used towards other participants in the breed show world. The comments were generally indefensible.

KC File for February

The penalty imposed is to reflect that the online comments were at such an unacceptable level in the context of Kennel Club licensed events and not appropriate, particularly given Mr Davidson's capacity as a Kennel Club approved judge.

The Disciplinary Committee is committed to drive home and ensure that the bandwidth of acceptable social media conduct in the ambit of the Kennel Club licensed events must be, as most people understand, within the realms and bounds of reasonable and respectful activity, and those engaged in behaviours beyond that boundary should expect censure and sanction at an appropriate level. That was the principle applied in this case.

The Kennel Club has recently introduced the Yellow/Red card process to provide additional measures to address conduct including social media content connected with licensed events. However, if social media activity goes beyond the bounds of what might be considered under that process and is at such an extreme or prolific and habitual level then the full extent of the Kennel Club disciplinary process will be deployed.

Rule A11 a (1) (b)

Any act or conduct which in the opinion of the Board is discreditable or prejudicial to the interests of the canine world and relates to or is connected with;

(b) the breeding, exhibition and judging of dogs, or any other canine activity

KENNEL CLUB RULE A12

The Committee having carefully considered the convictions of Mr Lee Howard of Kettering, Northampton for causing unnecessary suffering offences contrary to the Animal Welfare Act 2006 from the Northampton Magistrates' Court on 30 August 2023.

The Committee impose the following penalties:

- To disqualify him from exhibiting at, taking part in, attending and/or having any connection with any event licensed by the Club. If any person disqualified under this subparagraph shall attend any canine event whilst disqualified the Board shall have the power to increase the period of disqualification [A11 j (4)]
- To disqualify him from being or becoming a member of any canine club or society registered with or affiliated to the Kennel Club [A11 j (5)]
- To disqualify him from acting as an Officer or serving on the Committee of any canine society [A11 j (6)]
- To disqualify him from taking part in the management of any event licensed by the Club [A11 j (7)]
- To disqualify him from judging at any event licensed by the Club [A11 j (8)]
- To disqualify him from effecting registrations of any or all dogs and/or progeny of such dogs which are owned and/or registered by him (whether or not jointly owned and/or whether or not owned and/or registered in the name of a nominee) [A11 j (9)]

The suspensions and disqualifications are to be for Life from 30 November 2023.

The Committee noted that Mr Howard pleaded guilty to charges of causing unnecessary suffering to a dog, two cats, a parrot and two cockatiels namely by failing to take such steps as were reasonable in all the circumstances to ensure that the needs of the animals for which he was responsible were met to the extent required

by good practice in that suitable environment, continuous access to an adequate supply of clean fresh drinking water, need to be able to exhibit normal behaviour patterns, to be protected from pain, suffering, injury or disease.

The Court imposed an 18 week custodial sentence suspended for 18 months; a Rehabilitation Activity Requirement of 20 days; and a lifetime disqualification in respect of all animals from dealing in them, owning them, keeping them, participating in keeping them and from being party to an arrangement under which Mr Howard is entitled to control or influence the way in which they are kept, transporting them and arranging for the transport of them.

The Kennel Club is duty bound to follow and at least reflect any period of disqualification given by the Court. The Committee noted the custodial sentence (suspended) which was imposed by the Court.

Mr Howard pleaded guilty to offences involving a clear and unacceptable lack of the Animal Welfare Act considerations. This is entirely incompatible with being associated with and using Kennel Club registration facilities. The Committee's view was that a lifetime disqualification from Kennel Club regulated activities is appropriate to reflect the seriousness of the matter.

As with previous cases involving offences under the Animal Welfare Act 2006 it is worth expressly stating that any breeder must ensure that the needs of an animal must be met to the extent required by good practice under the Animal Welfare Act 2006 including;

- its need for a suitable environment,
- its need for a suitable diet,
- its need to be able to exhibit normal behaviour patterns,
- any need it has to be housed with, or apart from, other animals, and
- its need to be protected from pain, suffering, injury and disease

REGULATION F3

Leeds Championship Show

Mrs C Lee-Slater

- The Committee upheld a breach of Kennel Club Regulation F 3 and issued a Warning and Censure and imposed a fine of £100.00.
- The Committee directed that Mrs Lee-Slater should issue a personal apology directly to Mr Robb.

The complaint involved as part of a livestream at the event, an inappropriate and degrading comment was made about an exhibitor.

Regulation F3;

Those taking part in Kennel Club licensed/ approved events are expected to maintain and abide by the highest standards, in accordance with Kennel Club Rules and Regulations and appropriate Codes of Conduct as published from time to time.

The Kennel Club Code of Conduct provides

- Conduct - participants have a duty both to their dogs and to others to make licensed events friendly and welcoming, and are expected to be co-operative and above all to create a safe environment, so all can enjoy their time at licensed events
- Sportsmanship - participants should conduct themselves at all times in an appropriate fashion and should display good manners and respect towards other participants, show officials and to the judges

ADVICE TO REGISTERED SOCIETIES ON WAYS TO MANAGE CONDUCT ISSUES AT KC LICENSED EVENTS

Resolve on the day; Report to the Kennel Club; Refusal of future entry to society events

We would like to take this opportunity to remind registered societies of the penalties at their disposal in the event that they are faced with conduct issues at their events. The recently announced yellow/red card system which the Kennel Club has added to the existing Kennel Club escalation process has prompted questions about the measures that societies themselves can take.

Whilst the yellow/red card system is only for Kennel Club use, societies can refuse entries and record incidents for referral to the Kennel Club.

Both processes are summarised below:

1. Refusal of Entry

Kennel Club Regulations for all disciplines allow the society concerned to review poor conduct by a participant and, by way of a warning and to protect their events, to refuse entries from an exhibitor/competitor for a set period of time. A written communication to the individual should state that the committee has agreed to refuse entries for XX months/years.

This should be a decision taken by the committee of the society, with some reasoning recorded in the minutes, but which is not detail that should be passed on to the person(s) concerned. The committee of a registered society has a right to protect its events, to maintain a safe, welcoming and happy environment for all. Refusal of entry is a practical and immediate option open to all registered societies. There is further guidance on the exercise of the refusal of entry available on request (for enquiries about the process please email breedshows@thekennelclub.org.uk.)

2. Incident Book

A decision to refuse entry may have stemmed from an incident at a licensed event, and we therefore offer the following reminder about effective use of the incident book. All licensed events must have an incident book available and the process for its use is set out on the following link: <https://www.thekennelclub.org.uk/events-and-activities/incidents-at-events>

There are several key things to remember in this process. A report made in the book should be clearly documented and include full contact information for the parties involved, witnesses and particularly if a handler is involved (and as such contact details may not be otherwise available). Without the contact details this can slow down and delay the progress of a matter in trying to locate relevant parties and witnesses.

If the incident is to be escalated to the Kennel Club, it should be submitted as soon as possible. It is the responsibility of the society to log any incident – even if at the time those involved indicate that they do not wish to take action.

It should also be noted that the tick box which says 'resolved on the day' should only be ticked if there is no further action required by any party.

The system is similar to the refusal of entries by a society, except that the issue of a red card means that an exhibitor may not enter any Kennel Club licensed event for a set time.

The yellow/red card system adds to the already existing penalties available under Kennel Club Regulations, to give additional support to warnings, and to present a much sharper 'deterrent' value for conduct issues relating to participation at a particular licensed event (but may include pre or post event activity). It is hoped that it will reassure everyone that the Kennel Club is taking action to address unacceptable or inappropriate behaviour in the context of licensed events and associated social media activity.

Clarification of the application of yellow/red card for social media and Kennel Club licensed events

The Kennel Club has introduced the yellow/red card measure to address inappropriate conduct at Kennel Club licensed events including complaints about social media activity relating to or associated with a Kennel Club licensed event. The purpose of the measure is to address any conduct by a participant at a licensed event or social media activity related to such event (whether pre, during or post such event). Individuals should report any issues to the Kennel Club or to the club or society on the day of an event for onward reporting to the Kennel Club via the incident book.

This measure is effective for issues arising from 1 November 2023.

A breach of a Kennel Club conduct regulation/Code of Conduct may still attract other penalties such as fines or, for more serious cases, under Rule A11 where there are options to disqualify individuals.

In line with the escalation policy, in cases of prolific, habitual and extreme content and activity on social media, then the matter may be escalated to a Rule A11 for consideration by the Disciplinary Committee. Serial and habitual content of an inappropriate nature may attract the more serious sanctions under the Rule A11 disciplinary process. For judges, it remains that a complaint about inappropriate social media engagement may also still be made by reference to the Code of Best Practice for Judges.

Relevant factors determining the level of response to social media content will include:

- The extreme nature of language used
- Threatening, bullying, discriminatory or intimidating language
- The tone and tenor of the posting
- Whether the social media engagement was a one-off aberration or prolific (habitual) activity
- Impact on an individual
- Impact on Kennel Club licensed events
- Whether the posting acted as a catalyst for a damaging momentum and traction and any further engagement
- Whether there is genuine remorse, contrition and direct apology offered

It is not intended to censor personal opinion being expressed but, in some cases, there will be little excuse or mitigation if specific comments are very clearly beyond the threshold of reasonable, mindful

and respectful engagement. It is acceptable for opinion, criticism or disagreement or indeed disappointment to be expressed openly but it should be done in a reasonable and respectful manner.

A review of social media content in the context of licensed events is not intended to provide a personal and individual remedy; it is not akin to and is not a substitute for a complaint of defamation which an individual may be entitled to pursue as a result of comments made about them. Defamation is not a basis for a complaint in this context. Identification or specific references to an individual(s) is not required.

The concern is that social media does provide a platform for constructive discussion, but it is very easy for such discussion to degenerate into inappropriate comments which will cause hurt and distress. This may be inadvertent and social media sometimes acts like an 'echo chamber', allowing for momentum and traction – and which magnifies the impact if there is wide scale sharing and engagement. Care is therefore needed if private and personal opinions are to be made public. It is especially important not to deliberately or inadvertently be the catalyst for a conversation and allow others to build up a momentum of online comment.

A very different environment in terms of personal engagement both at licensed events and on social media is expected and anyone crossing the threshold of reasonable and respectful engagement is going to be captured by the new measures. The Kennel Club Board and the Disciplinary Committee are very serious and committed to this outcome. Everyone can play their part in this by tempering their own social media engagement and leading by example.

The Kennel Club Code of Conduct

Conduct - participants have a duty both to their dogs and to others to make licensed events friendly and welcoming, and are expected to be co-operative and above all to create a safe environment, so all can enjoy their time at licensed events.

Sportsmanship - participants should conduct themselves at all times in an appropriate fashion and should display good manners and respect towards other participants, show officials and to the judges.

Where any participant criticises licensed events, show/event organisers and judges, other exhibitors or their dogs in inappropriate, hurtful or excessive ways on social media this will be reviewed under the conduct regulation for the respective licensed canine activity and in particular the use of the yellow/red card measures where appropriate.

CHANGES TO SHOW REGULATIONS IN 2024

The Kennel Club has approved a number of amendments to the F (show) regulations which came into effect on 1 January 2024, these include the confirmation of the introduction of Baby Puppy classes at breed club shows, which featured in a Kennel Club Press Release (**Kennel Club specimen schedules revised for 2024**) issued on 18 December.

The introduction of Baby Puppy classes (for dogs of 4 months and less than 6 months old) will create more opportunities for training and socialisation

in young dogs and lead to an increase in entries at breed club shows. The idea was proposed by The Kennel Club Shows Liaison Council, which is a key channel for the dog community to make positive changes to the dog showing world. Any societies that have published their show schedules and now wish to add the class should email breedshows@thekennelclub.org.uk where providing entries have not yet closed the team will be able to help.

A number of amendments to the F (show) regulations in 2024 were also proposals from The Kennel Club Breeds Liaison Council which is another channel for grass roots exhibitors to review the show scene and advise The Kennel Club on any changes that may be needed to enable showing to continue and flourish.

CHANGES TO HEELWORK TO MUSIC REGULATIONS

The Kennel Club has approved the following changes to the regulations for heelwork to music.

The below regulation has been created to provide guidance to the heelwork to music community and to emphasize that training rounds would be at the discretion of the judges. It was intended to detail what was acceptable during a training round.

New Regulation L13

TO:

New Regulation L13 Practice rounds.

Practice rounds are permitted at the judges' discretion and the judges' decision is final, provided their main purpose is to aid the dog's or handler's confidence and their experience of the working ring, and subject to the following:

- Where practice rounds are allowed, they must be available for all competitors in that class and must comply with the division entered.**
- The time taken must not exceed the duration for routines at the relevant level.**
- The use of toys which emit any noise, and the use of food are not permitted.**
- The usual rules and etiquette for those who compete must be followed except that the handler may use as many cues as necessary to aid the dog, and may touch the dog in a non-harmful and nonintimidating manner.**
- Excessive exuberance from the handler or dog will not be permitted if the judge considers that it could interfere with the chances of winning of other dogs and handlers.**

Clubs may cancel a judging appointment where there is clear evidence that the judge's ability to fulfil the appointment has been adversely affected, or in consultation with the judge.'

Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the first day of the competition are eligible to take part in Level 1, 2, or 3 classes. Only dogs of 12 calendar months of age and over on the first day of the competition are eligible to take part in Level 4 or higher classes or special classes which incorporate jumps or similar exercises. **Only dogs of 7 years of age and over on the first day of the competition are eligible to take part in the Veteran class.**

Level 2

- Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 1 or Level 1 Excellent title, except those that have achieved a Level 2 or Level 2 Excellent title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 1 may also enter at this level.

Level 3

- Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 2 or Level 2 Excellent title, except those that have achieved a Level 3 or Level 3 Excellent title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 2 may also enter at this level.

Level 4

- Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 3 or Level 3 Excellent title, except those that have achieved a Level 4 or Level 4 Excellent title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 3 may also enter at this level

Level 5

- Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 4 or Level 4 Excellent title, except those that have achieved a Level 5 or Level 5 Excellent title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 4 may also enter at this level.

Level 6

- Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 5 or Level 5 Excellent title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 5 may also enter at this level.

Veteran

- Open to all dogs aged 7 years or over on the first day of the competition.

When a jump exercise requires a handler to take a path off set to the jump, the lateral measurement should be 1.5 metres taken from the base of the inner edge of the nearest jump upright.

The judge must choose track and search articles suitable to the nature of the ground and stake being judged and which are unlikely to be in any way injurious to the dog. The articles must be well handled and placed, not dropped, or buried, by a steward who shall foil the ground by walking in varying directions over the area. CHANGES TO OBEDIENCE REGULATIONS

The Kennel Club has approved the following changes to the regulations for Obedience.

The following regulation amendment has been made to simplify judging requirements to make it quicker and easier for people to become qualified, retaining their motivation and enthusiasm. It was

hoped that this would encourage more competitors to step up to the judging role.

Amendment to Regulation G.32.c. Approval of judges.

TO:

Qualifications for judges at premier and open shows and for the non certificate classes at championship shows-

On first appointment judges must satisfy the show committee that they:

- have judged a minimum of four appointments ~~within at least two years at a lower level including limited/companion obedience shows and matches/club or fun competitions~~ **won out of Beginners at a licensed championship, premier or open obedience show as a handler.**
- have won out of Beginners at a licensed championship, premier or open obedience show as a handler, and have acted as a caller **steward or scribe (for the whole class) for any scheduled standard classes or marker steward on six eight** occasions at licensed **championship, premier or open shows, at least three of which must be as caller steward and**
- have completed and passed an Obedience Regulations and Judging Procedure examination on The Kennel Club Academy prior to attending a Kennel Club Obedience Test Design and Practice of Judging seminar.
- have attended a Kennel Club Obedience Test Design and Practice of Judging Seminar and passed the assessment.

- d. In any exercise attempted the competing team cannot lose all the allocated points for that exercise but must be awarded a minimum of **two one** points for each exercise they have attempted.
- e. The detailed test will be:

- (1) ~~Play with dog for 15-30 seconds on or off lead at the handler's choice. Handlers may use a silent toy~~ 10 points

Engagement – this will be marked throughout the test – the use of motivators and rewards before and between exercises which may include food, silent toys, tricks, and verbal and physical praise within the reward area of the ring. Toys and food in a sealed container,

must either be left on the reward table, or be concealed in the handler's pocket during tests, where only verbal motivation may be used to keep the dog engaged. 10 points

~~(2) Heel on lead~~ 10 points

Heelwork to be set and marked as 2 distinct exercises:- 2a. 'Heelwork set up on lead' and 2b. 'Heelwork on lead'

- (a) **Heelwork Set up – on lead, handler to set the dog up in heelwork position, in a designated spot, facing the judge, on steward's command. Handler to be asked if they are ready, when this is acknowledged, steward will say 'end of test'** 2 points
 - (b) **Heel on lead, from a moving start and detailed in Annex G(C)4 c and d – Tests** 8 points
 - (3) Recall with a finish on lead, off lead or long line, at the handler's choice 10 points

When instructed, the handler will halt and then turn to face the dog. When instructed, the handler will recall the dog which must return briskly – no present is required, but will not be penalised – once the dog has returned, the steward will say 'end of test'** 6 points

Throughout the test the handler may not touch the dog or make use of the lead without penalty. Heelwork may include large circles or arcs as part of the heelwork exercise.

(1) Introductory Class. ~~Heelwork to be on lead and will be a large circle or straight line. Heel on Lead will be broken down into distinct tests, as detailed above, Heelwork from a moving start, to be on lead and will be:-~~

- a) A large 'figure of 8' 8 points
- b) Or a large 'S' shape 8 points
- c) Or an arc or circle in one direction, break off and reward and the pattern then repeated in the opposite direction 4 points plus 4 points

- a. A bitch which is in season (apart from dogs ~~attending the show to compete competing~~ in quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules).

The hoop to be of a consistent shape, constructed of an impact-absorbing material. **All tyres should have bands diagonally opposite each other in contrast to its basic colour or segments in contrasting colours.** The tyre/hoop must be directly mounted in a substantial frame structure which must be secured in such a way that dogs cannot knock the obstacle over from either direction; the frame shall not have a beam across the top.
- All tyres must have easily displaced element(s). For saloon style tyres, both opening sides

must have an ability to swing open to 90-140 degrees from the closed hoop position. They must not self-return and must be manually re-set.

It is now not required for dogs to make contact with the up contact area of the dog walk or A Frame, however, they must still touch the ascending ramp. 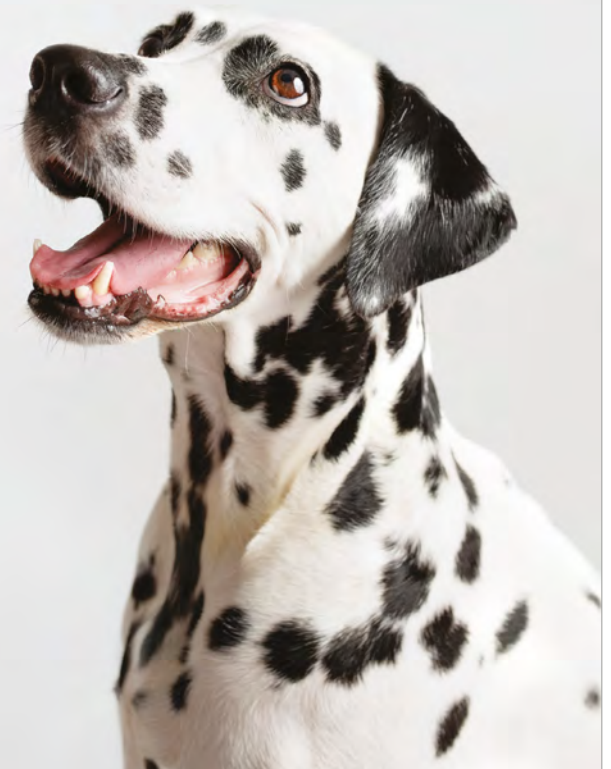
